The text of the play is a composite of four distinct manuscripts dating from the 15th and 16th centuries. The play has its roots in 1633, when almot every family was devastated by the bubonic plague. The play is a staging of Jesus' passion, covering the short final period of his life from his visit to Jerusalem and leading to his execution by crucifixion; it is the earliest continuous survivor of the age of Christian drama. The play is 5-7 hours long, presented in one day, runs 102 days, featured every ten years, the last year of each decade ending in zero.

The production involves over 2000 performers, musicians and stage technicians—ALL residents of sionals.
